#### Leak adjustment for account 288

Webb brought a leak adjustment for account 288 Hung Chau, unusually high bill and found multiple leak points within the restaurant Rice Bowl, spent thousands replacing equipment and toilets. Requesting adjustment above the \$300 max to the full 1/3 or \$537.80. Customer was proactive and went above and beyond to not only stop the leak but to replace potential leak issues as well. Commissioner Pope that he did not believe that our policy covered interior plumbing, Webb agreed to table the leak while clarification is sought and policy is clearly agreed upon by the board.
